Our new Deputy Provincial Grand Supreme Ruler



At the September meeting of Artington Conclave at Guildford Wy.Bro. Ian Ramon Bloodworth was installed as the Deputy Provincial Grand Supreme Ruler of the Provincial Grand Conclave of Surrey by our Provincial Grand Supreme Ruler, R.Wy.Bro. Colin M Beerling.

Ian was born in 1953 in Islington, North London. He attended Holloway Grammar School where he achieved good grades. During this period, Ian developed a passion for lots of different sports, including tennis, table tennis, but most of all football and he represented England school boys, where he achieved 13 caps.

During this period, Ian was signed by Tottenham Hotspur on schoolboy terms and, 2 years later, on professional terms. Breaking into the reserve team during his time at the club. Unfortunately, by the age of 25 he received a serious knee injury, which finished his professional career. It was after this time, that he moved to Suffolk.

After football, Ian took up flat green lawn bowls, where he went on to represent Essex and Suffolk for indoor bowls, gaining county honours for both organisations.

While Ian was at Tottenham, he studied for a degree in graphic design which opened up work opportunities in various industries, including media projects, designing items for Disney, Warner Brothers and Wimbledon Tennis Association.

After 22 years in graphic designing, he decided to have a change of career and moved to Putney to work in social housing, to which he worked for a further 6 years.

Ian is married to Sandra and currently lives in Cobham. Ian and Sandra decided to retire at the same time, when he was 58, and he decided on a new challenge. They bought some land in a village just outside Limerick and had their own house built. They lived there for 3 years and after this time decided to move back to the UK and live in Surrey. Ian's current hobbies include bowls, slot car racing, and he is an avid collector of films. He also enjoys travelling.

Ian was initiated into Masonry in 1988 at Mildenhall Lodge in the Province of Suffolk and became Worshipful Master in 1997, eventually receiving Provincial Honours. In the Holy Royal Arch Chapter, Ian joined White Rose Chapter in the Province of Suffolk in 1995, where he also received Provincial Honours.

In 1997 Ian joined the Order of the Secret Monitor at St Edmonds Conclave in the Province of Suffolk and became Supreme Ruler in 2005. He went on to receive Provincial Honours as a Steward, ADC, DepADC and in 2014 he was appointed Provincial Grand Director of Ceremonies. He also received Grand Rank appointments, as a Grand Steward in 2012 and then PAGDC in 2016.

Ian joined the Scarlet Cord in 2013 in Suffolk, Godric Consistory, and became their President in 2018. He received Provincial honours in 2019 as Standard Bearer and, in 2021, as Sword Bearer. During the periods in which he lived in Ireland and London, he still travelled to Suffolk for his Masonic meetings.

When Ian moved back to Surrey in 2016, he decided to join the OSM in Surbiton Conclave and the E L J Smith Conclave. He was made Deputy Provincial ADC in 2018 and in 2019 he was promoted to Provincial Grand Director of Ceremonies. In 2018 he joined the Scarlet Cord in Surrey Consistory No 4 T.I. and is currently the Provincial Grand Director of Ceremonies.

In the past five years, Ian has joined Priory Gate Lodge, Progress Chapter, the Mark Degree, Royal Ark Mariner, and Red Cross of Constantine.

Ian is an experienced, knowledgeable, and enthusiastic Mason and was therefore ideally suited to become our new Deputy Provincial Grand Supreme Ruler for the Province of Surrey, and we all wish him well in the future.
